EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING

FEBRUARY 13, 2018 FACULTY CONFERENCE ROOM

The meeting was called to order by Tom Nordenholz at 11:05 am.

The senate chair started the meeting introducing and welcoming Joe Campa to the senate executive meeting.

Joe Campa thanked the senate executive committee for reaching out to him and extending the invitation to participate in the academic senate executive committee meeting. He gave a brief introduction about his background and how he ended up taking the job at Cal Maritime. He succinctly explained about his plans with the Leadership program and appreciated the students input with the Motel 6 acquisition.

The faculty feedback on this policy will be obtained and after implementing all the suggested changes it will be posted for a faculty vote.

The RTP policy with changes has been discussed with the Provost and small changes as per Provost's advice were made during this discussion. The senate will reach out to the Library Dean and Library faculty to get their opinion about their inclusion into this process.
